Birdhouse #1 - Beehive Shaped In a Scotch Pine Tree, near post 74

Michigan produces a lot of these trees – we are one of the top 3 producers of this tree ...can you guess what holiday is probably responsible for its use?

Birdhouse #2 - Beehive Shaped

Oak Tree

Michigan has a lot of these trees. There are Red, white, black, pin, just to name a few. What type of nut does this tree produce?

(The average tree produces about 10 million of these in its lifetime!)

Birdhouse #3 - Beehive Shaped

Oak Tree, Near, near post 81/cactus

Birdhouse #5 - Beehive Shaped

White Pine Tree, near post 84/trail to outdoor classroom

This type of conifer grows quickly with relatively soft needles. The wood from this tree is used for furniture, flooring, and even paneling. It was always the favorite tree of loggers, since the logs could be processed through a lumber mill within a year of being cut down.

Birdhouse #6 - Acorn Shaped

Beech Tree, near post 85

These trees have smooth, gray bark. Sadly, the smooth bark of the trees often makes them a favorite for lovers' initials and other graffiti-even today despite now knowing that such habits can be detrimental to the tree. What is this tree, and is this tree (the one with the birdhouse) deciduous or coniferous?

Birdhouse #7 - Acorn Shaped

Birch Tree, Near Lake Ridge trail access point

These deciduous trees are renowned for their distinctive bark, which often features striking colors and unique textures. The bark of these birch trees can range from snowy white to silvery gray, and some species exhibit peeling or curling bark that adds to their allure. This distinctive feature sets these trees apart and makes them easily recognizable in diverse landscapes. In the past canoes were sometimes made using their bark.
